PASTOR'S ARTICLE

It started in a Bible study years ago when the material called for me to bring my pastor's garb to class. It seemed a minor point to me, but I wanted to teach about the different Bible verses that each part of the "uniform" were supposed to cause us to remember. I was surprised how riveted the people in the class were as I explained each part. The robe reminds us that all who are baptized in Christ are clothed with the robe of His righteousness as Paul writes in Galatians. The cross necklace reminds us that we pastors do not preach ourselves but we preach Christ, which is a stumbling block for some and foolishness to others but is the power of salvation for those who believe as Paul writes in his letter to the Corinthians. The stole, which is the colorful sash thing, reminds us that we carry the burden of Christ, which is easy and light as we learn from Him, as Jesus Himself is recorded as saying in the book Matthew wrote. Finally, the belt reminds us, as does Paul in Ephesians, to "put on the belt of truth." When I finished teaching these connections to the class, many expressed gratitude in now knowing what all of those things that the pastor wears mean. That is when the idea started to explain and teach about things that often get taken for granted.

To that end, a new series of sermons is about to begin. It will start on September 17th and will conclude on October 22nd. It will be a series to teach about the different things we see in worship week in and week out. It seems good to send ourselves back to school about these things that can get taken for granted as we send our students back to their new school year.

On September 17th, we will learn about the meaning of the cross. It is not that Christians have a fascination with the letter T. It is that Christians have a fascination with the lengths to which the true God went to save His creation.

On September 24th, we will learn about the meaning of the altar. It is not just the beautiful decoration that the pastor stands in front of or behind when he leads prayers. It is the table upon which God serves up our food of salvation.

On October 1st, we will learn about the meaning of the candles. It is not just a remembrance of the generations that did not have electric lights. It is attention to the light that God has called us into out of ignorance's darkness.

On October 8th, we will learn about the lectern and the pulpit. It is not just that we like two different speaking podiums. It is the honor and reverence we hold for God's Word.

On October 15th, we will learn about the Baptismal Font. It is not just something we pull out of the corner when we need to use it. It is the vessel used to do the special work Jesus has entrusted His church to do.

On October 22nd, we will finish up with the pastor's garb.

So, in this season when we send our students back to school, let us all go back for some new and old lessons that enrich our worship and lives.



LADIES AID NEWS




