Serving Schedule

My children have told me that I never cry. The most recent time I heard this got me to thinking about whether or not my children have ever seen me cry. If they have, neither they nor I remember the incident. I admit that it is not a common occurrence for tears to flow, but it has happened. So my children are wrong about me never crying because I do cry. All of us cry.

There are a few memorable incidents of me crying. Let me tell you about the strange one. I was a young man. I had grown up some but not all the way. I think I was in my early teens. By then I was past the crying over little things stage of life. (I think my children notice that I ‰ever+cry because they have not grown out of this stage.) One morning, I woke up crying. I woke up because something terrible had happened in my dream. I do not remember how it happened, but my brother had been killed. He had been killed and I was the only one there and I got to cradle his dead body in my arms and rock back and forth and sob and weep and cry over and over that ‰want my brother back. I want my brother back. I want my brother back.+I woke up after that. You can imagine that I looked at my brother differently that day. Freud would probably suggest that I had been in an argument with my brother and my psyche was trying to tell me that I really do love my brother. Anyway, of all the times I remember crying, the dream about losing my brother is the strangest, but the reason I was crying was a solid reason.

There are incidents when it is good and right to cry. There are times when it is good and right to be sad. Lent is such a season. Lent is a season for us to rightly know and lament our sins. Lent is a season for us to rightly know and lament the cost of our sins. Lent is a season for us to sadly affirm that we need to be saved from our sins and that the One who saved us ended up dying. Lent takes us into the dark deepness about things that are sad.

Our Lent worship services on Wednesdays will focus on Gods call to us to come home. That we are not in our eternal home with God is a sadness. That we are not welcome there because of our sin is a sadness. There are good and right reasons to be sad and the situation that led to Jesusqlife, death, and resurrection is one of those reasons. We are blessed to hear the story of Gods salvation that brings us into our eternal home with God. Our Lent worship services will make sure that we spend time on the sad part of the whole story of Gods salvation.
