#### **SCRIP**

What is Scrip? Scrip cards are gift cards that we purchase at a discounted rate and then sell to you at full price, and you can use the card at full price when you shop at the retailer you selected. Scrip is available for all your remodeling projects (Menards, Home Depot, Lowe's) hunting & fishing (Fleet Farm, Bass Pro Shop, Cabela's), but don't forget gas, groceries & prescriptions too. Discounted % can be applied to Family Education Fees for next year or General Fund, please specify. (if using Family Education Fees 1/2% still goes to the General Fund), example: \$100 Fleet Farm gets 5% so either \$5 goes to General Fund or \$2.50 Education Fees & \$2.50 General Fund). Order forms are available from either the church or the school office, next to the scrip boxes located at the office entrance & by the fellowship sink. Orders will be placed March 1st & 15th at Noon. ## DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME

Daylight Saving Time begins Sunday, March 11, 2018



# Remember to Set Your Clocks Forward You know the old saying: spring forward, fall back. It helps us to remember how Daylight Saving Time affects our clocks twice each year.

During Daylight Saving Time, which begins in the spring, clocks are turned forward an hour, shifting an hour of light from the morning to the evening. When Daylight Saving Time ends in the fall, clocks are set back an hour and Standard Time resumes.

According to the present schedule—determined by the Energy Policy Act of 2005—the United States *springs forward* at 2:00 am on the second Sunday in March, and *falls back* at 2:00 am on the first Sunday in November.

#### WHAT'S NEAR TO YOU?


Author Robert Louis Stevenson said, "The best things in life are nearest." He referred to air in our nostrils, light for our eyes, flowers at our feet and work before us.
