#### **IN THE CLASSROOM**

The third and fourth graders are continuing to work on division and multiplication. The third graders have been introduced to two digit multiplication and the fourth graders are focusing on long division. These are vital building blocks for all of the students. Some of the students could still use strengthening of their basic multiplication and division math facts.



The fifth and sixth graders are getting pretty sick of fractions, but we continue on with our mastery of them. The fifth graders are working with improper fractions and mixed numbers. The sixth graders are discovering the relationship between fractions and percentages.

The seventh graders are working on circumference and area of a circle. We are working with terms like diameter, radius, and  $A = \pi r^2$ . The eighth graders are finding slope, equations of the line and surface area.  $x = \sqrt[3]{125} \pm \sqrt{36}$ .
