#### ACCELERATED READER

The Accelerated Reader program is part of the reading class for all seventh and eighth grade students. The students are required to acquire a certain number of points a quarter. If the student achieves more than the required amount of points, extra credit will be applied to their reading grade, but getting less than the required points will be unfavorable to their reading grade. There are over 150,000 books available in the school library or the Sturm Memorial Library. <u>Upcoming events:</u> Fire prevention week will be the second week in October. Please go over fire safety with your child at home. We will also go over it here at school.


